

Installing the „Latin International-A“ keyboard V1.00 on Windows 8/10/11

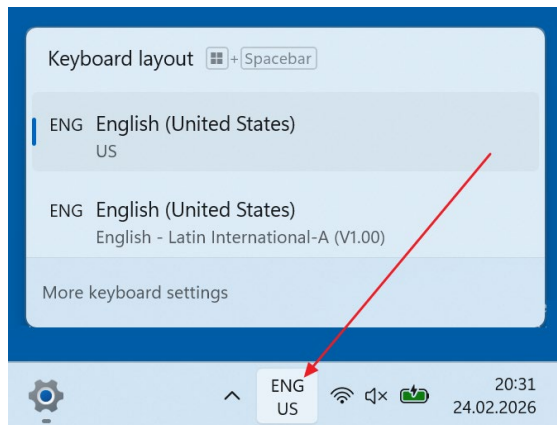

Your installation directory must look like:

Then, doubleclick setup_kbISOLA1.exe, and let the installation process get finished.

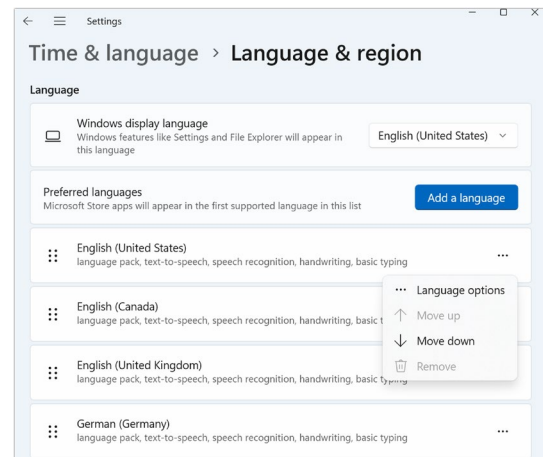
If successful, you now you can switch between your keyboard layouts by typing the Windows key together with the Space key, or use the taskbar:



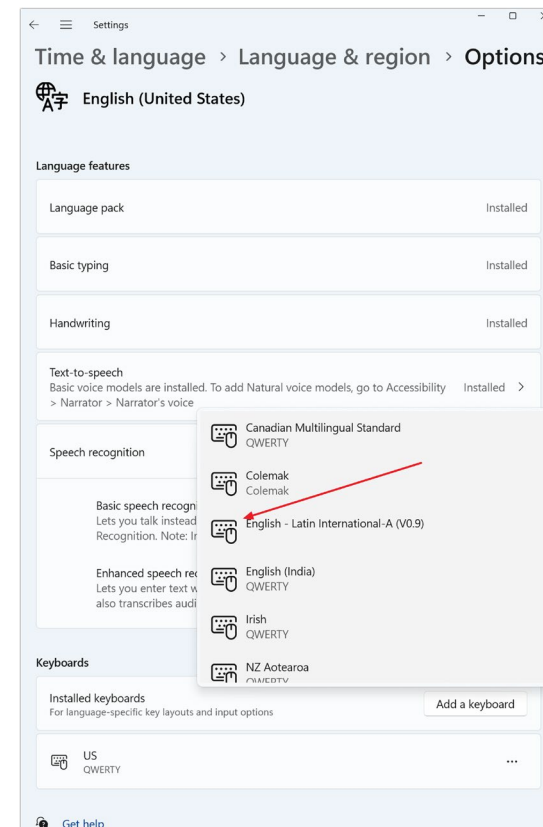
Depending on your operating system, in some cases it is necessary to restart your system first.

If the layout does not appear even after doing this, use your system settings. There, select “Time & language” then “Language & region”.

Click on the three dot sequence right off your language. You see something like this:



Then, click “Add a keyboard” right off the text “Installed keyboards”. You see something like this (maybe after some scrolling in the keyboard list):



Now, you should be able to switch between your keyboard layouts by typing the Windows key together with the Space key.
